## **New Labor Laws for Business in 2016**

Oregon's 2015 Legislative Assembly proved challenging for businesses of all sizes. Many business leaders and organizations have deemed the session as the most unfavorable business has seen in Oregon history. The session resulted in revisions to existing as well as new labor and employment laws.

Oregon Bureau of Labor & Industries Commissioner Brad Avakian will speak at the chamber's November 16 membership meeting about some of the laws going into effect in 2016. Avakian was elected to the Oregon House of Representatives in 2002 and to the Oregon Senate in 2006. He was first appointed labor commissioner in April 2008 and was then elected to a full term in November 2008.

One topic sure to be discussed at the luncheon is Oregon's new mandatory paid sick leave law, which goes into effect January 1, 2016, for Oregon employers with 10 or more employees. Regulations regarding the new law are currently being drafted.

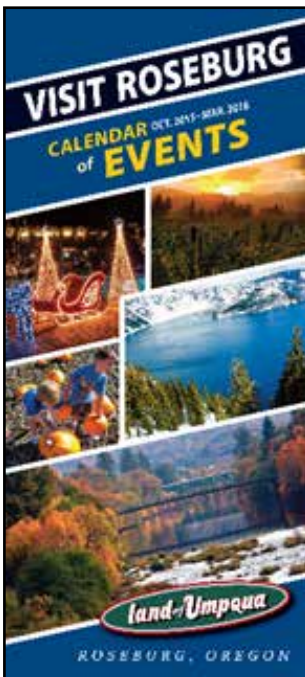
